### WHAT is happening?

In accordance with the site Odour Management Plan, Seafield WwTW site operators, Veolia, will be undertaking routine emptying and cleaning of the four storm water tanks shown below. Despite the forecast of onshore winds it is deemed appropriate to carry out the work now in order to mitigate against the risk of the sludge in the storm tanks becoming an odour risk in its own right. The work has been reviewed through an Odour Risk Assessment process and notified to Scottish Water and regulators.

# WHY are we telling you?

As part of our ongoing commitment to minimise any inconvenience associated with the operation of the treatment works, we recognise the need to maintain open communication with our neighbours. The storm water tanks are cleaned approximately 10 times per year and whilst this exercise is routine in nature we are providing this specific update due to the forecast onshore wind conditions.

## WHEN is this happening?

Work is scheduled to commence on the morning of Thursday 16th May and Veolia shall endeavour to complete this work by Friday 17th May We shall inform stakeholders when this activity has been completed.

#### WHERE is this happening?

The four storm water tanks sit centrally within the treatment plant.
